



Coptic Christian Prayer Book

- Agpeya is Coptic for "Book of the Hours"
- Prayers for seven different hours of the day
- Filled with Psalms, Gospel readings, Litanies
- Used by Copts to pray throughout the day
- Also prayed at the beginning of the Divine Liturgy

"Seven times a day I praise You, because of Your righteous judgments." (Psalm 119:164 NKJV or 118:164 LXX)

Agpeya – Coptic Prayer "Book of the Hours"



Agpeya Hours

• 1st "Prime" Hour (6 AM or upon waking up)

To commemorate the **Resurrection** of our Lord Jesus Christ. To be prayed in the morning to give thanks to God for the beginning of a new day, and to glorify Him for His Resurrection.

• 3rd Hour (9 AM)

To commemorate the **descent of the Holy Spirit** upon the disciples and the hour which our Lord was condemned.

- 6th Hour (12 PM) To commemorate the crucifixion of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- 9th Hour (3 PM)

To commemorate the **death** of our Lord Jesus Christ on the Cross and the acceptance of the thief on the right.

Agpeya Hours (cont'd)

- 11th "Vespers" Hour (5 PM)
 To commemorate the hour in which the
 Body of our Lord Jesus Christ was taken down from the Cross and anointed with spices and wrapped in linen.
- 12th "Compline" Hour (6 PM or before retiring)
 To commemorate the laying down
 of our Lord Jesus Christ in the tomb.
- The Prayer of the Veil
 This prayer concerns monks & nuns, yet is also suitable for individual meditation. It is prayed daily in monasteries.
- The Midnight Prayer (has 3 services 9 PM, 12 AM, 3 AM)
 To commemorate the three times our Lord Jesus Christ prayed in Gethsemane.


Psalm Numbering

- Coptic Agpeya Psalms follow the numbering of the Septuagint (LXX) Greek translation
- Psalm 23 NKJV is **Psalm 22** in LXX

"The LORD is my shepherd;
I shall not want."

Psalm 51 NKJV is Psalm 50 in LXX

"Have mercy upon me, O God, According to Your lovingkindness; According to the multitude of Your tender mercies, Blot out my transgressions."



What is LXX?

- LXX = 70
- LXX is an abbreviation for the Septuagint translation of Old Testament scripture from Hebrew to Greek
- Seventy or seventy-two Jewish rabbis and scholars gave us the Septuagint Greek Old Testament, producing seventy-two **identical** Greek translations working independently and in isolation from one another.
- The translation of the Septuagint itself began in the **3rd century** BC in Alexandria and was completed by 132 BC. It is said that 6 scholars were commissioned from each of the 12 tribes of Israel by Ptolmey II.
- The Septuagint is the **basis** for the Old Latin, Slavonic, Syriac, Old Armenian, Old Georgian and **Coptic** versions of the **Christian Old Testament**.
- The **New Testament** (Greek) text, as well as many **Patristic** writings of the first Christian centuries, **quote** Old Testament (Greek) **Septuagint** text.

 - Holy, Holy, Holy
- Lord have mercy
 - 41 Kyrie Eleison each hour of prayer
 - 39 lashes received by the Lord, one spear, one crown of thorns
- Supplications
 - Specific prayer requests each hour
 - Should be followed by own personal prayers

Why Coptic Christmas is celebrated January 7th

The **Julian** Calendar is shorter than the common **Gregorian** Calendar by 2.367 seconds per day.

• In 100 years, the difference amounts to one full day.

In the **13-14**th **century**, an attempt was made to correct the actual birth-date of Christ, adjusting for the difference between calendars:

- At that time, Christmas was celebrated on the December 25th.
- The actual birth-date should have been correctly observed **13 days** later (1 day for each of the 13 centuries that passed), i.e. January **7**th.
- The Church adjusted the date to January 7th from that time onwards.

When is **Easter Celebrated?**

At the **Council of Nicaea** (325 A.D.), it became one of the duties of the patriarch of **Alexandria** (the Coptic Church) to **determine** the dates of the **Easter** and to announce it to the other Christian churches.

This duty fell on this officiate because of the great scholarly knowledge at Alexandria that the Coptic patriarch could draw on.

The mathematical rules to determine this are complex, but Easter is the **first Sunday after a full moon occurring after** the northern vernal equinox, which falls on or after **March 21**st, which was its nominal date at the time of the First Council of Nicaea.


A = MOD (**2019**, 19) = **5 B** = MOD (19 x **5** + 24, 30) = **29 D** = (21 + **29**) = **50**


Western Easter: First Sunday after D of March

Easter Date Calculations

- Western Calculation
 - March 22nd is the earliest possible Easter date
 - April 25th is the latest possible Easter date
- <u>Eastern</u> Calculation (used by the Coptic Church)
 - April 4th is the earliest possible Easter date
 - May 8th is the latest possible Easter date
- The calculations are always **0**, **1**, **4**, **or 5 weeks** apart
- Most often, the delta is 1 week (Eastern being 1 week after Western)
- Eastern Easter is always later than, or on the same Sunday as Western




Pillars of Spiritual Life: Prayer, Fasting, Charity

Coptic Church utilizes 3 important spiritual exercises:

- PRAYER is medicine that combats against Pride
- FASTING combats against the Lust of the Flesh
- CHARITY combats against the Lust of the Eyes

Spiritual exercises are a <u>means</u> to live a Heavenly Life.



When Coptic Christians Fast

- Before Communion 1
- Wednesdays & Fridays
- Before <u>Christmas</u> 3 (43 days = 40 awaiting the Logos + 3 days added for el Mokattam miracle)
- Jonah's Fast (3 days) 2
- Before <u>Easter</u> 2 (55 days = preparation week, 40 days of lent, passion week)
- Apostles' Fast (3)
 (after Pentecost until July 12)
- Saint Mary's Fast (3) (August 8-21)

LEGEND

- 1 = abstinence with no food or drink
- 2 = vegan meals (no animal products)
- 3 = vegan and/or seafood

IMPORTANT NOTE

Accompany dietary fasting with fasting of the senses, a focus on repentance, prayer and charitable deeds.

Weekly (Wednesday & Friday) Fasting

These days are fasting ("siyami" in Arabic) days in remembrance of:

- the betrayal of Our Lord Jesus by one of his disciples on Wednesday
- the crucifixion of Our Lord for our salvation on Good Friday


Wednesday & Friday fasts are observed all year round, with the <u>exception</u> of the 50-day joyful Pentecostal period (Easter until Pentecost) where there is no fasting ("**fitaar**" in Arabic means "not fasting").

Preparing for Christmas

Advent Fast: 43 days (40 + 3)

- As Moses fasted 40 days to receive the Ten Commandments, the Word of God written on tablets of stone
- We also fast 40 days to receive Jesus Christ, the living incarnate Word of God
- 3 additional days were added to the start of the Advent Fast, in remembrance of the 3-day fast leading up to the great miracle of Moving the El-Mokkatam Mountain outside of Cairo in the 10th Century





Preparing for <u>Easter</u>

Great Fast: 55 days (7 + 40 + 8)

- 7 day pre-Lent preparatory week leading up to Great Lent
- 40 day Great Lent Fast
- 8 days of Holy Week leading up to Easter Sunday:
 - Lazarus Saturday
 - Palm Sunday
 - Passion Week (including Covenant Thursday and Good Friday)
 - Bright Saturday

An additional <u>3-day (Jonah's Fast)</u> to remind us to repent as the Ninevites did, 2 weeks prior to the start of the Great Fast.






Service & Intercession

The Apostles' Fast

- Apostles' Fast follows the 50-day Pentecostal Period and ends with the Commemoration of the Martyrdom of the Apostles Peter & Paul on July 12
- A focus on **service**: we are called to serve like the Apostles






Saint Mary's Fast

- A two-week fast (August 8-21) precedes the Feast Day commemorating the Assumption of the Body of Saint Mary
- Many diocese use this fast as an opportunity for Spiritual Revival, calling on the loving <u>intercession</u> of our mother, the Virgin Saint Mary

Advice from Moses: choose life!

"See, I have set before you today life and good, death and evil, in that I command you today to love the LORD your God, to walk in His ways, and to keep His commandments, His statutes, and His judgments, that you may live and multiply; and the LORD your God will bless you in the land which you go to possess. But if your heart



turns away so that you do not hear, and are drawn away, and worship other gods and serve them, I announce to you today that you shall surely perish; you shall not prolong your days in the land which you cross over the Jordan to go in and possess. I call heaven and earth as witnesses today against you, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing; therefore choose life, that both you and your descendants may live; that you may love the LORD your God, that you may obey His voice, and that you may cling to Him, for He is your life and the length of your days; and that you may dwell in the land which the LORD swore to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, to give them." (Deut. 30:15-19)

Where do we go <u>after this life</u> on earth?

- <u>Paradise was CLOSED before Christ's Crucifixion</u>

 When one died in the Old Testament, even if they had lived a righteous life, their spirit descended to Hades (as Paradise was not yet opened).
- Christ OPENED Paradise, reconciling us to God through His Cross

"Lord, remember me when You come into Your kingdom."

And Jesus said to him,

"Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise."

• Christ's spirit descended to Hades to save the righteous.

Christ gave up the spirit, His body was taken down & buried for 3 days;

Christ's spirit descended to Hades and freed the spirits of the righteous,

leading them from Hades to Paradise, along with the right-hand thief!

Christ's descent into Hades



... to rescue the faithful and lead them to paradise

Where do we go <u>after this life</u> on earth?

- After Christ's Crucifixion (for us now)
 The spirits of those who have accepted the Lord as Savior depart to Paradise; the spirits of those who reject the Lord go to Hades.
- At Christ's awaited Second Coming, all the dead will rise ...

 The spirits of the righteous would re-unite with their bodies, taking on a glorified body to enter the Kingdom of Heaven; those who refused salvation would be condemned to eternal condemnation in Hell.

"Do not marvel at this; for the hour is coming in which all who are in the graves will hear His voice and come forth: those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of condemnation." (John 5:28-29)

Three Stages of Righteous Life

1 Heavenly Life on Earth (body & spirit)

Christ's (**first**) coming to **save** us. **He opened Paradise** on the Cross, for the spirits of the righteous.

2 Life in Paradise (our spirits rejoice in the presence of God)

Christ's **second** coming is to **judge** all, and to open the **Kingdom of Heaven**.

3 Eternal Life (glorified body & spirit) in the Kingdom of Heaven


Heavenly Life on Earth

- Life of Prayer (talking with God, in constant communion with God)
- Life of **Repentance** (Metonia = change of mind, return to God)
- Living the Word of God (not about just reading, listening to, studying, memorizing, teaching, or preaching God's Word ... but Living the Bible)

BIBLE = "Basic Instruction Book for Life on Earth"

- Life of Submission to God's will (emulating Saint Mary)
- Life of Self-Control & Purity (aided by fasting & prayer)
- Life of Agape Love & Forgiveness
- Life of Service & Charity
